### The Stockholm-Oxford Doctoral Research Conference

### 18-19 September 2024 at Christ Church, Oxford

This Doctoral Research Conference is being held by the Stockholm Centre for Commercial Law (SCCL) at the Faculty of Law, Stockholm University, in conjunction with its Nordic university cooperation aimed at strengthening interactions between Nordic private and commercial law legal scholars. The conference is also part of the SCCL's cooperation with the Institute of European and Comparative Law (IECL) at the Faculty of Law, the University of Oxford. Consequently, doctoral students with research projects relating to commercial law in a broad sense (for example, where relevant also in private law, procedural law, criminal law, public law, tax law, labour law, etc.) from all Nordic universities, as well as current participants in the Oxford IECL Research Masterclass, are invited to attend this conference.

The Conference, including meals, is free of charge for all accepted participants. Accommodation for one night is also offered free of charge for those participating Nordic doctoral students. #### OXFORD AND CHRIST CHURCH

University of Oxford is the oldest university in the English-speaking world. There are over 26,000 students at Oxford (of which about 13,000 are graduate students). The University is a truly international environment – over 40 % of the academic staff and over 65 % of the graduate students come from countries outside the United Kingdom.

The University of Oxford comprises 36 independent and self-governing colleges, three societies, and four Permanent Private Halls, each with its own history, culture, internal structure and activities. The Colleges create a unique academic and social environment that is interdisciplinary, creating natural and regular contact areas between students, researchers and teachers.

Everyone studying in Oxford has to be attached to a certain college and most colleges accept members in all the subjects offered by the university. The Colleges provide accommodation, meals and leisure activities for their students and are responsible for the supervision of students at the undergraduate level. Christ Church is one of Oxford's most famous colleges and was founded in 1546 by Henry VIII of England.

The chapel of Christ Church is also the Cathedral of diocese Oxford. It is about 300 years older than the college and was originally part of a monastery dedicated to St Frideswide. In addition, the college has a famous library and its own art museum, the Picture Gallery.

#### THE STOCKHOLM CENTRE FOR COMMERCIAL LAW

The Stockholm Centre for Commercial Law (SCCL) was established in 2000 as a part of the Faculty of Law at Stockholm University. The SCCL promotes scientific research and doctoral studies in the field of commercial law in a broad sense. The SCCL is led by Professor Göran Millqvist as Director. Twenty-five researchers are active at the SCCL, which makes it the leading commercial law research centre in the Nordic Region. Research is conducted partly through research panels and partly by individual research efforts within and outside the SCCL.

# THE COOPERATION BETWEEN THE FACULTIES OF LAW AT OXFORD AND STOCKHOLM

The SCCL and the Faculty of Law at Stockholm University have since 2011 a cooperation agreement with the IECL and the Faculty of Law at the University of Oxford, focused on the establishment of a post-doctoral research fellowship at the University of Oxford for Swedish academics. However, the cooperation goes back even further through Professor Ulf Bernitz in his roles both as Coordinator of the Stockholm-Oxford Collaboration, as well as a permanent Visiting Researcher at the IECL from 2001 until his death in 2022. To date, eleven Stockholm Centre Oxford Fellows have each spent a year at the IECL. The Fellowship is affiliated with Christ Church and the Fellows since the inception of the cooperation have graciously been provided the benefit of participating in the academic and social community there. Six senior Stockholm academics have also spent sabbaticals in Oxford. The cooperation over the years has also resulted in numerous seminars, conferences and publications.
